Whereas, George Mason, as author of America's first bill of rights, has penned such needed reminders that "by frequent recurrence to fundamental principles" we build character and provide effective citizenship and training; and

Whereas, we the people value the elective process as essential to our life, liberty, and pursuit of happiness, and to safe guard our freedoms;

Now, therefore, I, Brad Henry, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim February 2, 2007, as

"Colonial Day at the Capitol"

and do hereby declare the Colonial Williamsburg teachers and their students in colonial session for the day.
